This letter serves to acknowledge Spyder Controls, Corp's notification to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) of a safety recall which will be conducted pursuant to Federal law for the product(s) listed below. Potential Number of Units Affected: 3,419

Problem Description:

Spyder Control, Corp (Spyder) is recalling certain G9 electronic control units, part numbers BMODWTIR1, DMODZTIR4, and BMODWTIR4. These units can fail if excessive voltage is applied, causing the components on the board to become damaged.

Consequence:

If too much voltage is applied to the unit and the circuit board becomes damaged, there would be an increased risk of fire.

Remedy:

Spyder has notified the affected component purchasers, who have filed their own recalls, and will provide a G9 Protection module to limit voltage, free of charge. Owners may contact Spyder customer service at 1-403-782-9738.

Please be reminded of the following requirements:

Copies of all notices, bulletins, dealer notifications, and other communications that relate to this recall are required to be submitted to this office no later than 5 days after they are originally sent (if they are sent to more than one manufacturer, distributor, dealer, or purchaser/owner).

Please be reminded that under 49 U.S.C. § 30112(a)(3), it is illegal for a manufacturer, to sell, offer for sale, import, or introduce or deliver into interstate commerce, a motor vehicle or item of motor vehicle equipment that contains a safety defect once the manufacturer has notified NHTSA about that safety defect. This prohibition does not apply once the motor vehicle or motor vehicle equipment has been remedied according to the manufacturer's instructions.

Please identify whether or not Spyder will be able to fill the six consecutive quarterly status reports that are required.
