! IMPORTANT SAFETY RECALL !

REPLACE REAR REFLEX REFLECTOR

Safety Recall: SRAN582

This notice applies to your motorcycle:

Model: Tiger 900 (2020), Tiger 900 GT (2020), Tiger 900 Rally (2020), Tiger 900 GT Pro (2020), Tiger 900 Rally Pro (2020) and Tiger 900 GT Low (2020).

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the requirements of the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act. Triumph Motorcycles Ltd. has decided that your motorcycles may fail to conform to regulation FMVSS No. 108 (lamps, reflective devices, and associated equipment). Triumph is conducting a safety recall to address the condition.

The reason for this recall notice: Your motorcycle's rear reflex reflector may have the incorrect fasteners and could fall off. If the reflector is missing, affected motorcycles may be less noticeable to drivers of approaching vehicles which increases the risk of a crash.

What Triumph Motorcycles Ltd & your dealer will do: Triumph Motorcycles Ltd has authorized your dealer to replace your rear reflex reflector free of charge to you including parts and labor. This repair should take around 6 minutes. However, depending upon the dealer's work schedule, it may be necessary to make your motorcycle available for a longer period of time.

What you must do to ensure your safety: Please make an appointment with your authorized Triumph motorcycles dealer to have this important remedy performed on your motorcycle as soon as possible.

Federal regulations require that any vehicle lessor receiving this recall notice must forward a copy of this notice to the lessee within 10 days.

If you need help: Please contact your authorized Triumph dealer should you have any questions or encounter any difficulty regarding this recall. In the event your dealer is unable to remedy your motorcycle, please contact Triumph Motorcycles America at 1-678-854-2010.

If you previously paid to have this recall performed on your motorcycle, you may be eligible for reimbursement. Please contact Triumph Motorcycles at 1-888-284-6288 for more information, including eligibility requirements.

If an authorized Triumph dealer or Triumph Motorcycle America Ltd, fails or is unable to perform this remedy without charge within a reasonable amount of time, you may contact the Administrator, National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, 1200 New Jersey Avenue SE., Washington, D.C., 20590; or call the toll-free Vehicle Safety Hotline at 1-888-327-4236 (TTY: 1-800-424-9153); or go to <http://www.safercar.gov>.

If you no longer own the motorcycle listed above, please contact Triumph at 1-678-854-2010 and provide any information you can furnish that will assist us in locating the new owner.
