IMPORTANT SAFETY RECALL (Interim Notice)

**Certain 2020 Model Year Porsche Cayenne and Cayenne Coupe Vehicles
Transmission oil pipe may leak
NHTSA ID 20V-271**

Dear Mr. [REDACTED],

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act. Porsche has decided that a defect that relates to motor vehicle safety exists in certain 2020 Porsche Cayenne vehicles.

You received this notice because our records, which are based primarily on state registration and title data, indicate that you are the current owner of a vehicle affected by this action.

What is the issue?

On some of the affected vehicles, an insufficient weld on a transmission oil pipe could cause transmission fluid to leak. If a transmission fluid leak occurs while driving, the road may become slippery, which could increase the risk of a crash.

What will Porsche do?

The transmission oil pipe will be inspected by your Porsche dealer and replaced with a replacement part if necessary. These repairs will be covered free of charge. At a future date, once all parts are available in a sufficient quantity, Porsche will send an additional letter asking that you contact your authorized Porsche dealer for completion of this recall.

What should you do?

Please wait for our follow up letter to bring your vehicle in for a remedy. In the meantime, if your transmission malfunction warning light is illuminated, please immediately contact any authorized Porsche dealer to schedule an appointment.

What if you are not the owner or operator of this vehicle?

If you are the lessor and registered owner of the vehicle identified in this action, the law requires you to forward this letter immediately via first-class mail to the lessee within ten days of receipt.

If you have changed your address or sold the vehicle, please fill out the enclosed prepaid Owner Reply Card and mail it to us so we can update our records.

If you believe that the dealer or Porsche has failed or is unable to remedy the defect without charge or within a reasonable amount of time, you may file a complaint to the Administrator, National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, 1200 New Jersey Avenue, S.E., Washington, D.C. 20590 or call the toll-free Vehicle Safety Hotline at 1-888-327-4236 (TTY: 1-800-424-9153) or go to: <http://www.safercar.gov>.
