Problem Description:

Shyft Group is recalling certain 2020-2021 RV Chassis K2, K3, K4 vehicles. The steering gear mounting fasteners may come loose, and fall out or interfere with other steering components.

Consequence:

If the steering gear mounting fasteners interfere with other steering components, difficulty in steering may occur, increasing the risk of a crash.

Remedy:

Shyft Group will notify owners, and dealers will remove and replace the steering gear mounting fasteners, free of charge. The recall is expected to begin in February 2021. Owners may contact Shyft Group customer service at 1-800-582-3454.
