Problem Description:

Stonebrooke Equipment INC. (Stonebrooke) is recalling one 2019 RAM 5500 vehicle. The rear brake caliper flexible line can contact suspension components, causing excessive wear and a brake fluid leak.

Consequence:

A brake fluid leak can result a loss of the rear brakes, increasing the risk of a crash.

Remedy:

Dealers will inspect, replace the rear brake caliper flexible line if necessary, and install banjo blocks, free of charge. Owners notification letters are expected to be mailed by June 30, 2021. Owners may contact Stonebrooke customer service at 1-952-244-4440.

As stated in Part 573.7, submission of the first of six consecutive quarterly status reports is required within one month after the close of the calendar quarter in which notification to purchasers occurs. Therefore, the first quarterly report will be due on, or before, 30 days after the close of the calendar quarter.
