AFFECTED VEHICLES: Certain 2022 and 2023 Outlander and 2023 Outlander Plug-in Hybrid vehicles

PURPOSE:

Notification letters for approximately 90,000 vehicles affected by recall SR-23-001 "NAVIGATION (IVI) OPERATION FAILURE", are being mailed to owners today, June 20, 2023, requesting they contact their local Authorized Mitsubishi dealership to schedule an appointment to have this recall performed. A sample copy of the owner notification letter is included below for your reference.

Mitsubishi Motors North America, Inc. (MMNA) has decided that certain 2022 and 2023 Outlander and 2023 Outlander Plug-in Hybrid vehicles fail to conform to Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard No. 111, "Rear Visibility." A software error in the A-IVI could cause a black screen to momentarily display during a backing event. The loss of rearview image during a backing event could increase the risk of a crash or an injury to a person behind the vehicle.

Two USB drives containing the reprogramming software were sent via FedEx on June 5, 2023, to the Service Managers' attention at each dealership. You should have already received them.

Each USB drive will be labeled "SW Update 5185", as shown below:



PLEASE ONLY USE THE USB DRIVE LABELED SW UPDATE 5185 WHEN PERFORMING THIS RECALL

Affected new vehicle inventory VINs can be reviewed on the Mitsubishi Dealer Link in the Most Recent: Open Campaign List available under the service section of "e-reports." **Dealers must review the Warranty Superscreen to confirm if any vehicles in their new or used vehicle inventories are affected and complete this campaign prior to delivering them.** When checking for the applicability of this campaign (**C2301R**), please check for and complete any other open campaigns. Some of these vehicles may also be affected by the fuel pump recall (C2202R) and/or one of the seat belt recalls (C2108R) or (C2201R), and/or ECU reprogramming service campaign (C2303R).

NOTE: The software update for this recall (SR-23-001) contains the countermeasure software utilized in SR-22-003 - Improper Operation of Audio Unit (C2203R). There is no need to complete C2203R after SR-23-001 is completed.

Always obtain the customer's approval before completing a campaign on a customer owned vehicle.

IMPORTANT

Affected new or used inventory vehicles must be repaired before the vehicle is sold/delivered. Dealers must check their inventory vehicles' VINs on the Warranty Superscreen to verify whether the vehicle is involved in this recall campaign. It is a violation of Federal law for a dealer to sell/deliver a new motor vehicle or any new or used item of motor vehicle equipment (including a tire) covered by the notification under a sale or lease until the defect or noncompliance is remedied.

Reason for notice: Mitsubishi Motors North America, Inc. (MMNA) has decided that certain 2022 and

2023 Outlander and 2023 Outlander Plug-in Hybrid vehicles fail to conform to Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard No. 111, "Rear Visibility." A software error in the Alliance In-Vehicle Infotainment (A-IVI) Display Unit could cause a black screen to display during a backing event. The loss of rearview image during a backing event

could increase the risk of a crash or an injury to a person behind the vehicle.

What you should do: Please contact your local Mitsubishi Motors dealer and schedule an appointment to

have the A-IVI reprogramed, free of charge. When you bring your vehicle in, please show the dealer this letter. If you misplace this letter, the dealer will still perform

this repair on your vehicle, free of charge.

What your dealer will do: The dealership will reprogram the A-IVI with modified software.

How long will it take? The time needed for the reprogramming is approximately **30** minutes. The dealer

may need your vehicle for a longer period of time, but every effort will be made to

minimize your inconvenience.
