! IMPORTANT SAFETY RECALL !

MAP (MANIFOLD AIR PRESSURE) HOSE REPLACEMENT

Safety Recall: SRAN609
NHTSA Recall: 23V583

This notice applies to your motorcycle:

Model: (2022-2024) Trident 660 and Tiger Sport 660

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the requirements of the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act.

Triumph Motorcycles Ltd. has decided that a defect which relates to motor vehicle safety exists in your motorcycle, with the VIN shown above. Triumph is conducting a safety recall to address the condition.

The reason for this recall notice: An obstruction can change the air pressure arriving at and recorded by the MAP Sensor. The MAP sensor requires accurate manifold air pressure readings in order to send correct information to the ECU. The ECU will adjust the air/fuel ratio based on the data received from the MAP sensor. On defective motorcycles inaccurate MAP data can lead to unstable idle and sometimes an engine stall, increasing the risk of a crash.

What Triumph Motorcycles Ltd & your dealer will do: Triumph Motorcycles Ltd has authorized your dealer to replace the Map Hose, free of charge to you including parts and labor. This repair should take around 30 minutes. However, depending upon the dealer's work schedule, it may be necessary to make your motorcycle available for a longer period.

What you must do to ensure your safety: Please make an appointment with your authorized Triumph motorcycles dealer to have this important remedy performed on your motorcycle as soon as possible. To find your nearest dealer, please visit <https://www.triumphmotorcycles.com/dealers/dealer-search>.

Federal regulations require that any vehicle lessor receiving this recall notice must forward a copy of this notice to the lessee within 10 days.
