This notice is sent to you in accordance with the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act.

Multiquip, Inc. has decided that certain 2024 WTE5C and WTE5HP trailers fail to conform to Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard (FMVSS) number 105, "Hydraulic and Electric Brake Systems" and 108, "Lamps, Reflective Devices, and Associated Equipment." This is to alert you of a potential issue involving a Multiquip 525-gallon water trailer that you recently purchased.

Your water trailer may have a wiring harness issue. The trailer **brakes may fail to engage or engage unexpectedly** when the turn signal is activated, due to wiring that is incorrectly connected between the turn signal and electric brakes.

Brakes that fail to engage when applied and unexpected brake engagement while driving increase the **risk of a crash**. Malfunctioning turn signal lights warn that brakes may also malfunction.

IMPORTANT! If you have experienced this issue, immediately stop using the trailer. Continued use may result in an accident, causing severe injury or death.

Immediately contact our Field Service Manager, Derrick Pasalich, at 310-613-4890 to schedule an inspection and repair at no cost. This inspection and repair of the trailer plug wiring will take approximately an hour. Appointment scheduling is available immediately.

If the trailer is sold or is no longer in your possession, please provide the new owner's contact information so we can reach them directly.

If you are a lessor of this vehicle, Federal law requires that you forward a copy of this safety recall notice to the lessee within 10 days.

If you have already paid for this repair, you are eligible to receive reimbursement for the cost of repairs made prior to receiving this notice. You may submit your receipt(s) by email to dpasalich@multiquip.com.
