

Safety Recall Notice: 24PBF

IMPORTANT SAFETY RECALL Interim Notification

April 23, 2024

Subject: Safety Recall: 24PBF - Sheppard Steering Gear Sector Shaft

NHTSA: 24V233

Dear Peterbilt Customer,

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act.

Peterbilt Motors Company has decided that a defect which relates to motor vehicle safety exists in certain model year 2025 536/548/567/579 vehicles built from 08/02/2023 through 01/11/2024. The steering gear(s) in these vehicles may contain components that were not adequately heat-treated during assembly. Specifically, the sector shaft gear teeth may not meet hardness standards and could be susceptible to premature wear, cracking, or fracture. A fractured gear tooth may interfere with the gear mechanism leading to binding which in turn may increase the risk of a crash. If a sudden increase in steering effort is noticed, the driver should carefully steer the vehicle to a safe location.

What is the problem? Certain steering gears may have a sector shaft that does not meet hardness requirements.

What will your dealer do?

When parts and procedures are available, dealers will inspect and replace suspect steering gears.

What should you do?

There is no action required on your part at this time.

Peterbilt Motors Company has initiated this recall to remedy the issue at no cost to you. **Currently, parts and repair procedures are not available to correct this condition.** However, Peterbilt is required to notify customers of the existence of the identified safety defect. **You will be notified by mail when the parts and repair procedures become available**.
