Re: Stop Sale/Safety Recall: 2024 ZDX Passenger-Side Front Stabilizer Bracket Bolt Inspection

On January 16, 2025, Acura notified NHTSA of a **stop sale** and **safety recall** for 118 units of model year 2024 ZDX vehicles. During assembly, the front stabilizer bar right side mounting bolts may have been improperly torqued. An improperly torqued mounting bolt may cause the stabilizer bar to separate and over time, loosen and fall out, allowing damage to the high voltage cables and EV battery coolant lines, rendering the vehicle undriveable and increasing the risk of a crash or injury. **Refer to your eResponsibility report or perform an iN VIN status inquiry to determine which units in your inventory are affected.**

REPAIR

Inspect the front stabilizer bar right side mounting bolts for proper torque specification and retorque or replace bolt(s) depending on inspection results.

PARTS

Parts will be available at launch. Please refer to the service bulletin for ordering instructions as Acura expects a very small number of vehicles will require a bolt replacement.

TOOLS

There are no new special tools needed for this recall.

SERVICE BULLETIN

Service Bulletin 25-013, *Safety Recall: 2024 ZDX Passenger-Side Front Stabilizer Bracket Bolt Inspection* posted to the Service Information System (SIS) as of January 17, 2025. It includes inspection, parts, repair, and warranty claim information related to this recall.

CLIENT NOTIFICATION

Acura expects to begin client notification in late February 2025.
