SYMPTOM DESCRIPTION

The 10.1" disassociated center stack display on about 133 of the above vehicles may contain a transistor that may overheat and prevent the rearview image from displaying on the media screen. The vehicle operator will notice that the rearview image is not displayed if attempting to reference the image while backing. If this warning is not heeded, backing up without verifying it is safe to do so could lead to an increased risk of injury to people outside the vehicle.

The condition above fails to conform to the requirements of Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard (FMVSS) No. 571.111 S6.2.6 requires that "The rear visibility system default to the rearview image being visible and meet the requirements of FMVSS No. 571.111 S6.2.1 (field of view) and S6.2.2 (image size) at the beginning of each backing event, regardless of any modifications to the field of view that the driver had previously selected." Suspect vehicles may not display the rearview image during a backing event.

SCOPE

NOTE: Some vehicles above may have been identified as not involved in this recall and therefore have been excluded from this recall.

REPAIR TO BE PERFORMED

All vehicles in this recall have been remedied. There is no action required.

All involved vehicle owners known to FCA are being notified by first class mail.
