



# IMPORTANT SAFETY RECALL

December 2025

This notice applies to your vehicle, **VIN:** \_\_\_\_\_.

Dear General Motors Customer:

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act.

Nissan Motor Company has decided that a defect which relates to motor vehicle safety exists in certain 2015-2018 model year Chevrolet City Express vehicles. As a result, GM is conducting a safety recall. We apologize for this inconvenience. However, we are concerned about your safety and continued satisfaction with our products.

## IMPORTANT

- Your vehicle is involved in GM safety recall N252531230.
- If you notice illumination of the malfunction indicator light (MIL), specifically the check engine light, please contact your GM dealer to arrange an appointment for diagnosis.

### Why is your vehicle being recalled?

The Fuel Tank Temperature (FTT) sensor harness may have been routed incorrectly, causing contact with the fuel pump motor spade terminal connector. Over time, this contact may wear away the protective coating and cause an electrical short, resulting in a blown fuel pump fuse. A blown fuel pump fuse can interrupt fuel delivery to the engine, causing it to stall and prevent the vehicle from restarting, increasing the risk of a crash.

### What will we do?

**The remedy and parts to repair your vehicle are not currently available**, but when the remedy and parts are available, your GM dealer will perform the necessary repairs, free of charge.

We are working as quickly as possible to correct this condition. When the remedy and parts are available, we will send you another letter asking you to take your vehicle to your GM dealer to have your vehicle serviced. If you have already paid for repairs for this condition, you may submit those charges using the reimbursement request form that will be provided with the next letter.
