IMPORTANT SAFETY RECALL

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act. Honda has decided that a defect related to motor vehicle safety exists in certain 2025 model year CB1000 motorcycles.

Why my vehicle is under recall: Due to improper piston and piston ring specifications, excessive engine oil consumption may occur. As the oil level drops below the minimum required level, oil pressure can decrease, potentially leading to the engine seizing. If the engine seizes, it may cause rear-wheel lockup, engine components to breach the engine case, and/or engine oil to contact the exhaust system or rear tire, increasing the risk of a crash, injury, or fire.

What Honda will do: The repair for your motorcycle is being finalized and is currently not available; however, it is expected to be available August 2026. Honda will send you a follow-up letter when the repair is available so you can then bring your motorcycle into the dealer for repair, for **FREE**.

What we need you to do:



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At this time, we ask for your patience while we finalize the repair. In the interim, it is important that the oil level in your motorcycle be routinely inspected. Please call any authorized Honda Powersports dealer and make an appointment to inspect your oil level every 300 miles to monitor for any oil consumption until the repair becomes available. The dealer will perform this inspection for **FREE**.

Once you receive a follow-up letter from Honda notifying you that the repair is available, please call any authorized Honda Powersports dealer and make an appointment to repair your vehicle for **FREE**.

If you are not the only rider of this motorcycle, please advise all other riders and passengers of this important information.

If you paid out of pocket to have these specific recall repairs performed on your vehicle, you may be eligible for reimbursement; please contact American Honda's Powersports Customer Relations at 1-866-784-1870 to determine potential eligibility and for instructions on how to request reimbursement.

If you no longer own this vehicle or if any of the information is not correct, please complete and return the enclosed prepaid Information Change Card as soon as possible. If you are a lessor of this vehicle, federal regulations require you to forward this notice to your lessee within ten days.

If you believe that American Honda or the dealer has failed or is unable to remedy the defect in your vehicle, without charge and within a reasonable period of time (60 days from the date you first contact the dealer for a repair appointment), you may submit a complaint to the Administrator, National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), 1200 New Jersey Ave., SE, Washington, DC 20590.
