Re: **EXPANSION-Stop Sale/Safety Recall: 2023-24 Multi-Model Driver's Seat Lift Link Bolt Loose**

On January 29, 2026, American Honda notified NHTSA of a **stop sale** and **safety recall** for 26 units of model year 2023 Accord, 2023 Accord Hybrid, 2024 HR-V, and 2024 Pilot. During manufacturing, a bolt in the driver's seat cushion frame assembly may have been improperly torqued. An improperly manufactured seat frame may not hold the seat in position during a collision, preventing the occupant from being properly restrained, increasing the risk of injury. **Refer to your eResponsibility report or perform an iN VIN status inquiry to determine which units in your inventory are affected.**

REPAIR

Replace the driver's seat cushion frame.

PARTS

Parts will be available at launch via the normal parts ordering process.

TOOLS

There are no new special tools needed for this recall.
