

DELIVERY STOP STOP610035 - K48/61 Reverser control unit

Recall 26V-214 has been filled with NHTSA for K 1600 GT, GTL, and Baggers. The affected units are flagged with delivery stop (STOP610035 - K48/61 Reverser control unit).

If you have a vehicle in your new/used inventory matching the above description it cannot be retailed until repaired.

During a quality inspection, it was found that humidity may enter the reverser control unit during the manufacturing process. Over time, this can cause corrosion on internal electrical connections, which could lead to overheating and thermal damage to the component.

Potentially affected vehicles are flagged in AIR (Aftersales Information Research) under campaign code STOP610035 - K48/61 Reverser control unit.

Please note that open campaigns or vehicle stops may not appear in DCS Warranty Vehicle Inquiry or sales systems until 24–72 hours after announcement; therefore, AIR is the recommended method for confirming open campaigns and vehicle stops. If you have a vehicle in your new/used inventory matching the above description it cannot be retailed until repaired. No vehicles should be impromptu repaired until technical measures have been posted. Next steps are being finalized, and a bulletin with technical measures will be published as soon as additional information becomes available.
