



New Safety Recall Advanced Communication – 36D

FCA US LLC (FCA US) has announced a safety recall on certain 2026 Model Year (DJ) Ram 2500 vehicles.

VINs identified as being involved in this campaign are currently live and searchable.
Stop sale is in effect for the above-identified vehicles.

Vehicles impacted by a stop sale are eligible for reimbursement allowance through the Recall Floorplan Reimbursement Policy (RFPRP), which can be requested upon recall claim submission.

IMPORTANT: Some of the involved vehicles may be in dealer new vehicle inventory. Federal law requires you to complete this recall service on these vehicles before retail delivery. Violation of this requirement by a dealer could result in a civil penalty of up to \$27,874 per vehicle. Involved vehicles can be determined by using the VIP inquiry process.

REASON FOR THIS SAFETY RECALL

Some of the above vehicles may have been built with a Steering Column Control Module (SCCM) which can experience an internal fault and disable Electronic Stability Control (ESC). An SCCM with an internal fault may result in the loss of ESC functionality when intervention is expected and/or relied upon which may cause a vehicle crash without prior warning.

The condition described above does not comply with Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard (FMVSS) No. 126 requires ESC to be active while driving. An SCCM with an internal fault may result in the loss of ESC functionality.

SERVICE ACTION

FCA US will conduct a voluntary safety recall to replace the SCCM. The remedy for this condition is not currently available. Dealers will be notified of the launch of this safety recall by way of established communication methods. This recall is estimated to launch in 2nd Quarter of 2026.
