- The repair will be performed FREE of charge.

**Re: Potential Fatigue Failure of Front Brake Caliper Support - Loss of Front Braking**

**National Highway Traffic Safety Administration Campaign ID Number: 26V220**

Dear Can-Am® Vehicle Owner,

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the National Traffic and *Motor Vehicle Safety Act*. BRP has decided that a defect related to motor vehicle safety exists in the following vehicles. As a result, BRP is conducting a safety recall.

**Our records show that you own a potentially affected vehicle.**

**What is the potential problem?**

A fatigue failure of the front brake caliper support may occur after multiple hard or emergency braking. If the support fails, front braking will be lost and it will increase the risk of a crash, causing injury or even death.

**Which models are involved?**

All MY25 and MY26 Can-Am Origin vehicles

**What will BRP do?**

BRP will repair your vehicle at no charge to you (parts and labor). The repair is to install a Caliper Support Reinforcement Kit on the front brake caliper support. It will take less than an hour to complete.

**What should you do?**

Schedule an appointment immediately with any authorized BRP Can-Am On-road dealer to have the safety recall repair performed on your vehicle. To find a dealer, see the end of this letter.

Parts for the repair will start being available starting the week of May 18.

This is a fatigue-related failure caused by repeated hard and emergency braking. From the factory, your vehicle was equipped with dual purpose tires. You may have installed other tires, including on-road tires. Using on-road tires

accelerates the fatigue. In this case, repair is strongly recommended before extensive and/or dynamic rides.

If you leased this vehicle:

- Send a copy of this letter to the lessee within ten working days after the day you received this letter.
- Do the same with any future letters about this safety recall.

**What to do if you feel you have received this notice by mistake?**

This notice was mailed to you according to the most current information we have available.

If you know the current owner or operator, please forward this letter to them.

If there has been a change of ownership or you have a change of address, please notify BRP so we can update our records accordingly.

**What to do if repairs were performed prior to the recall?**

If you have already paid to have your vehicle repaired for this issue, please contact BRP Customer Service. Our team will evaluate if you are eligible for reimbursement of the repair costs. Your vehicle will still need to have the safety recall performed.

**Can we assist you further?**
