Information: Procedure for replacing faulty ignition coils.

Cracks in the ignition coil housing ( $\Rightarrow$  *Figure 1*) can cause corrosion, which can result in a rough-running engine and misfiring.

Action If at least one ignition coil is diagnosed as faulty, the designation (with or without "EM 10",  $\Rightarrow$  Figure 2) Required: must be read off all ignition coils.

Depending on the designation ("EM 10") on the faulty ignition coil, either all ignition coils or a single ignition coil must be replaced,  $\Rightarrow$  see "Procedure".

	997.602.107.00	with "EM 10"	Only replace the ignition coil that was diagnosed as faulty.
