Subject: Audio From Left Front Speaker Only When Using Bluetooth

Models: 2012 - 2013 Chevrolet Sonic
with AM/FM Radio (RPO UH7)

This PI was superseded to update recommended field. Please discard PIC5778.

The following diagnosis might be helpful if the vehicle exhibits the symptom(s) described in this PI.

Condition/Concern

A Dealer technician or customer may comment that they only have audio from the left front speaker when using their bluetooth devices.

Recommendation/Instructions

Please verify the customers concern to determine if the concern is when making phone calls or when using audio streaming.

1. When using a Bluetooth device for phone calls, audio will only come out of the left speaker. This is normal operation.
2. If the concern is present with audio streaming (listening to music), verify the audio device (including cell phones) is linked to the Bluetooth music.

Vehicles with the AM/FM (non-MyLink) Radio (RPO UH7) are equipped with two (2) Bluetooth antennas:

- ⇒ On the OnStar Module (supports hands free phone function)
- ⇒ Within the radio (supports streaming audio from a compatible device)

Note: When using a cellular phone for audio streaming the phone needs to be paired twice with Bluetooth - once for Phone (Handsfree) and once for Audio Streaming (Music).



Please follow this diagnostic or repair process thoroughly and complete each step. If the condition exhibited is resolved without completing every step, the remaining steps do not need to be performed.
