# Subject: Replacing Power Steering Cooler

- Models: 2008 2013 Buick Enclave
  - 2009 2013 Chevrolet Traverse
    - 2007 2013 GMC Acadia
    - 2007 2010 Saturn Outlook

The following diagnosis might be helpful if the vehicle exhibits the symptom(s) described in this PI.

# **Condition/Concern**

Replacing a leaking or damaged power steering cooler without introducing a lot of air into the system.

# **Recommendation/Instructions**

When replacing a power steering cooler, perform the following steps:

- 1. Block off the hoses near the cooler connection with appropriate clamps.
- 2. Disconnect the cooler from the lines and remove the cooler.
- 3. Prefill the new cooler on the bench and cap off the pre-filled cooler ends for installation.
- 4. Install the new pre-filled cooler on the vehicle and remove the clamps on the hoses.
- 5. Follow the Power Steering System Bleed Procedure in service information.
