## PRELIMINARY INFORMATION

The new Ecotec 2.4L service engine will not have the intake manifold, high pressure fuel system or the ignition coils installed. These components must be transferred from the original engine. A new high pressure fuel feed pipe from the pump to the fuel rail must also be used. Do not reuse the original pipe as a fuel leak may develop.

For 2010 model year engine, in addition to the fuel system and ignition coils, the original intake camshaft and intake camshaft actuator must also be transferred to the new engine. Transferring these parts should be done while the engine is out of the vehicle.

Important: The new 2.4L Ecotec Service engines DO NOT come shipped with oil.

**Note:** For 2010 model engines, the camshaft does not need to be replaced if there is slight scoring (cannot feel with fingernail) on the lobe surfaces. If the camshaft is slightly dark/discolored, it does not need to be replaced. In most cases the camshaft and the cam actuator can be reused.

**Important:** For 2010-2011 models built before March 2011, check GWM to determine if the high pressure fuel pump was ever replaced. If it was not, replace with a new high pressure fuel pump.

Parts that need to be transferred from original engine to the new service engine:

- Intake Manifold
- Fuel Injectors
- High Pressure Fuel Pump
- Fuel Feed Pipe
- Ignition Coils
- Intake Camshaft (2010 Only)
- Intake Camshaft Actuator (2010 Only)
