Subject: Power Liftgate Inoperative With Key Off

Models: 2007-2014 Cadillac Escalade, Escalade ESV
2007-2014 Chevrolet Suburban, Tahoe
2007-2014 GMC Yukon Models
with Power Rear Liftgate (RPO E61)

This PI was superseded to update model years and add warranty information. Please discard PIT4116D.

The following diagnosis might be helpful if the vehicle exhibits the symptom(s) described in this PI.

Condition/Concern

Some customers may state that the power liftgate is inoperative from all the switches and the keyless entry transmitter only with the ignition in the off position. If the ignition is in the accessory or the run position, the liftgate will operate correctly.

Recommendation/Instructions

If you experience this concern, check for power on the "Accessory Wake Up Data Line" going to the ECM and the TCM. With the key in the accessory position, check for battery voltage on circuit 5985 going to pin 18 (2007 and 2010 to 2014 Model Years) or pin 31 (2008 to 2009 Model Years) of connector 1 of the ECM and Pin 11 (MT1 Transmission) or Pin 9 (for MYC transmission) to the TCM. If no voltage is present with the key in the accessory position, check for a wiring or pin fit concern.

Warranty Information

For wiring repairs covered under warranty, please refer to latest version of bulletin 10-00-89-005 for warranty information on wire/connector repairs.

Please follow this diagnostic or repair process thoroughly and complete each step. If the condition exhibited is resolved without completing every step, the remaining steps do not need to be performed.
