PRELIMINARY INFORMATION

Subject: Service Power Steering DIC Message With DTC C0545

Models: 2013 Cadillac ATS built prior to 2/26/13

This PI was superseded to add build date breakpoint. Please discard PIC5791.

The following diagnosis might be helpful if the vehicle exhibits the symptom(s) described in this PI.

Condition/Concern

In rare situations a customer may comment that upon starting the engine, the DIC displayed a Service Power Steering message and experienced a loss of steering assist.

This condition would only occur immediately following an engine start just after turning off the ignition and must be combined with a low voltage condition such as that of a low battery. The Service Power Steering message will be displayed on the DIC.

If the customer shuts the Ignition Off, waits 15 seconds for the vehicle modules to go to sleep, then restarts the engine, the concern will go away. The Power Steering Control Module (PSCM) will have stored DTC C0545 Symptom Code 00.

Note: It may be difficult for the dealer to reproduce this concern.

Recommendation/Instructions

SPS program the PSCM through TIS2WEB with the latest calibrations available. Follow SI procedures for SPS Programming and Configuration of the module.
