Condition/Concern

Customer may comment of a MIL, dealer technician may find history DTC P0335 and or P0336 stored in the HPCM.

Recommendation/Instructions

If the DTCs P0335 and or P0336 are found stored ONLY as history in the HPCM, please check ground connection G106 & G113.

If both grounds are clean and tight, attempt to reproduce the DTCs. If the DTCs do not reset please clear the DTCs and do not attempt any repairs at this time.

If either of the DTCs P0335 and P0336 are stored in the ECM as well as the HPCM or are current, please follow published SI diagnostics.
