Subject: Information on Elimination of Vehicle Nameplate Badges

Models:2014 Chevrolet Silverado 1500 (Texas Edition - RPO TUF and High Country Edition - RPO GAJ only)2014 GMC Sierra 1500 (All Terrain Edition - RPO GAT only)

Condition/Concern

Some customers or dealers may comment that the "Silverado" or "Sierra" nameplate badge is missing from the side doors of the vehicles on the Texas, High Country and All Terrain Editions.

Recently a change was made for the Texas/High Country (Chevrolet) and All Terrain Edition (GMC) trucks that removed the Silverado/Sierra nameplate badges from the side doors. The change was intended to give a cleaner, less congested branding appearance and was communicated through a Marketing Administrative message.

Plant Change Dates

Fort Wayne Built Trucks (VIN Z) – After VIN EZ163318 on October 3, 2013

Silao Mexico (VIN G) - After EG258922 on October 7, 2013
