Proper brake bleeding procedure for WABCO FULL POWER BRAKES

**Resolution:**

Technicians need to pressure bleed both the primary and secondary brake circuits any time either hydraulic system has been opened. Refer to Brake System Bleeding procedures listed

in [Service Manual S04048](#).



**Brake pedal feel does not necessarily indicate properly bled brakes. Brake pedal can feel firm or "normal" if properly bled between the reservoir and the HCU,; and air can still exist between the HCU and the brake calipers. Failure to correctly bleed the system could cause reduced braking or loss of braking, which may result in property damage, personal injury or death.**
