Subject: Rear Fascia Sticks Out Past Rear Tail lamp Assembly

Models: 2014 Cadillac CTS Sedan "VIN A"

The following diagnosis might be helpful if the vehicle exhibits the symptom(s) described in this PI.

Condition/Concern


A customer may comment that the rear fascia or bumper cover sticks out past the tail lamp lens as per picture below



Recommendation/Instructions

BEFORE removing the fascia please proceed with the following,

- 1. Remove the tail lamp from the same side of the vehicle with the fascia fit concern, being careful not to scratch the fascia
- 2. Inspect and measure the fascia retaining clip protrusion through the bracket to see if it measures 1.5mm as shown in the image below (might have to push the fascia back in installed position to measure the retaining clip protrusion if it is not engaged).



Loosen or remove the rear fascia to inspect for flashing in the mounting hole(s) that may be preventing the pin on the bracket from retaining the fascia properly as per PIC below.



While the fascia is removed, remove the flashing if any, and install the fascia to see if removal of the flashing resolves the issue. If flashing is not the cause or has been removed and the fascia clip still does not fully engage into the bracket, the bracket may need to be replaced.

Note: Do not replace the fascia for this condition unless the fascia flange is damaged.
