Subject: Dome Lamps Flash On And Off When Operating Brake Pedal Or Turn Signal

Models: 2015 Cadillac Escalade Models 2015 Chevrolet Suburban, Tahoe 2015 GMC Yukon Models

This PI was superseded to update Warranty Information and Labor Operation. Please discard PIT5334.

The following diagnosis might be helpful if the vehicle exhibits the symptom(s) described in this PI.

Condition/Concern

Some owners may comment when the dome lamps are off, if the brake pedal is applied or turn signal is operated, the dome lamp will flash on and off. This issue may also occur when other electrical loads are operated, but the brake pedal and left turn signal are the most common. There will be no DTCs related to this issue.

Note: NOTE: This concern is a different issue than described in the latest version of PI1268. The issue in PI1268 is while the dome lamps are on and the brake pedal is applied or turn signals are flashing there is a change in the dome lamp intensity.

Recommendation/Instructions

To correct this concern, replace both front overhead console lamps with GM Part Number 23104411.
