Subject: USB Ports Inoperative After Removing SD Card With Ignition Off

Models: 2015 Buick LaCrosse, Regal

Condition/Concern

Customers may comment that the USB port is inoperative or they receive a message of "No other media available" when pressing the Media button. They may also comment that the USB light illuminates but the radio does not recognize a device is installed. If an SD card was removed with the ignition off no other media devices will work when connected.

Recommendation/Instructions

If available, reinstall the SD card that was removed. If the original SD card is installed and removed with the ignition on all other USB devices will start working. If the SD card is not available please perform the following steps: Press Home>> Settings>> Return to Factory Settings>> Clear All Private Data. Turn ignition o for 5 minutes and retest USB operation.

Note: USB may need to be disconnected and reconnected.
