Subject: Whistle Noise From I/P When HVAC Is Used

Models: 2015 Chevrolet Colorado
2015 GMC Canyon

The following diagnosis might be helpful if the vehicle exhibits the symptom(s) described in this PI.

Condition/Concern

Some customers may comment on a whistle noise from the I/P when the HVAC is used. This can be present when driving or when sitting still. This may be caused by poor installation or fit of the cover for the cabin filter.

Recommendation/Instructions

1. Remove the IP Glove Box door following the "Instrument Panel Compartment Door Replacement" procedure in SI.
2. With the HVAC blower set in a low-to-medium blower speed range, check to see if the noise is coming from around the cabin filter cover.



3. If the noise stems from around the cover, verify it is properly installed as shown above. It may still be necessary to remove the door and reinstall - ensuring that the two end snaps are fully engaged and that the "Tongue & Groove" interface around the perimeter of the door to the module is fully engaged.
