Subject: Service Engine Soon (SES) Light Comes On with DTCs P0420, P0430 Set

Models: 2009-2011 Chevrolet Corvette ZR1 Equipped with 6.2L Engine (RPO LS9)

This Bulletin has been revised to update the Warranty Information. Please discard Corporate Bulletin Number 14-06-04-001.

## Condition

Some customers may comment that the service engine soon (SES) light is on. Technicians may find DTCs P0420, P0430 stored in history.

#### Correction

For the 2009-2011 model year exhaust systems, replace the catalytic converter and pipe assemblies, in between the exhaust manifolds and mufflers, with the 2012-2013 model year parts numbers listed below and update the ECM calibration.

**Important:** The technician will have to call in a for a VCI number provided by the Techline Customer Support Center (TCSC). Updating the components without the cal will cause the SES light to come on.
