Subject: Intermittent No Crank No Start Fob Program Message Displayed.

Models: 2012 - 2015 Buick LaCrosse

equipped with PEPS Keyless Start (RPO ATH)

The following diagnosis might be helpful if the vehicle exhibits the symptom(s) described in this PI.

Condition/Concern

A customer may indicate at times after unlocking the vehicle using the unlock button on the key fob, they enter the vehicle and depress the start button and the vehicle does not respond.

The vehicle will not crank and a message may display on the DIC "! Remote Learn Pending Please Wait " or " Ready For Fob Three " there will be no other response from the vehicle.

If the technician checks for DTC's he may indicate B3125 sym02, B3135 sym02 and/or B3130 sym02 are set.

Recommendation/Instructions

If this condition is reported exit and lock the vehicle. Wait 5 minutes, depress the unlock button on either fob 3-5 times within 10 seconds, then enter the vehicle.


If either message is displayed or the customer has commented on a similar concern, use the key to check the rotation of the driver's door lock cylinder.

If the key rotates further when unlocking then the normal 90 degrees, the vehicle may have been assembled with the incorrect door lock cylinder to latch rod.

Please remove the door latch assembly and check the rod. See the photos below to determine linkage configuration and replace the door lock cylinder to latch rod as required. Reference the Electronic Parts Catalog (EPC) to determine the correct rod to order / install.
