PRELIMINARY INFORMATION

Subject: Appearance Of Transmission Fluid Leak On Crossmember

Models: 2015 Chevrolet Colorado

2015 GMC Canyon

With manual transmission RPO N8D built prior to 01/05/15

The following diagnosis might be helpful if the vehicle exhibits the symptom(s) described in this PI.

Condition/Concern

Some customers may comment on the appearance of a fluid leak on the cross member under the transmission. Dealers may notice the appearance of fluid on the cross member during PDI.

Recommendation/Instructions

If you encounter a vehicle with signs of fluid on the cross member clean the affected area, check the fluid level of the transmission and dye to the transmission and operate long enough to mix the dye in with the fluid and reevaluate the transmission for a leak.

If no leak is found it is possible that when the powertrain was installed into the chassis at the assembly plant residual oil from the shipping plug was allowed to drip onto the cross member. Return the vehicle to the customer or lot.

If there are signs of a leak with the tracing dye then repair as needed.

Please follow this diagnostic or repair process thoroughly and complete each step. If the condition exhibited is resolved without completing every step, the remaining steps do not need to be performed.
