PRELIMINARY INFORMATION

Subject: Rear HVAC and/or Rear Heated Seats Unwanted Operation (Controls Sensitive)

Models: 2015 Cadillac Escalade Models

The following diagnosis might be helpful if the vehicle exhibits the symptom(s) described in this PI.

Condition/Concern

Some owners may comment that the rear HVAC and/or rear heated seats will change settings, or that the rear HVAC controls are too sensitive. In many cases, this concern is caused by a power cord touching or resting next to the rear HVAC controls. For example, if a cell phone power cord was plugged into the back of the center console and then run up to the top of the console where the cell phone would be plugged in, the cord would cut across the face of the rear HVAC controls, as shown below



Recommendation/Instructions

Engineering has released a new rear HVAC control to help reduce the potential for this concern. Replace the rear HVAC controls with updated part number 23259519.
