## PRELIMINARY INFORMATION

**Subject:** Malfunction Indicator Lamp (MIL) On - Service StabiliTrak - Power Steering Or Vehicle Soon Message Displayed On DIC

**Models:** 2010 - 2015 Chevrolet Equinox  
2010 - 2015 GMC Terrain

The following diagnosis might be helpful if the vehicle exhibits the symptom(s) described in this PI.

### Condition/Concern

Some customers may comment on any one of the following conditions:

- Intermittent malfunction indicator lamp on
- Service StabiliTrak message displayed on DIC
- Service Power Steering message displayed on DIC
- Service Vehicle Soon message displayed on DIC
- Service ABS or Traction control message displayed on DIC

When checking the vehicle for DTCs, the BCM, EBCM, ECM or TCM may be report high speed communication codes U0073, U0100, U0101, U0121 or U0140 or rear wheel speed sensor codes C0045, C0050 set as current or in history.

### Recommendation/Instructions

When diagnosing the condition, Technician may find multiple loss of communication codes current or history pertaining to the high speed GM High Speed LAN.

Dealer is to inspect connections at connector x411 and look for possible terminal corrosion due to proximity to rear wheel and location under vehicle. Please repair connector and/or terminals as needed.

### Warranty Information

For wiring repairs covered under warranty, please refer to latest version of bulletin 10-00-89-005 for warranty information on wire/connector repairs.

Please follow this diagnostic or repair process thoroughly and complete each step. If the condition exhibited is resolved without completing every step, the remaining steps do not need to be performed.

They are written to inform these technicians of conditions that may occur on some vehicles, or to provide information that could assist in the proper service of a vehicle.
