## PRELIMINARY INFORMATION

#### Subject: Informational - Comfort Open or Remote Venting Window Feature

Models: 2013 - 2014 Cadillac XTS

2014 CTS Sedan (VIN A)

The following diagnosis might be helpful if the vehicle exhibits the symptom(s) described in this PI.

#### **Condition/Concern**

Some customers may comment that the windows rolled down unwanted after using the key fob or they found all windows were down when returning to their vehicle.

#### **Recommendation/Instructions**

The vehicle may be equipped with comfort open or remote venting window feature.

Normal Operation of this feature:

As you approach the vehicle, press and hold the Unlock button on the Remote Keyless Entry (RKE) transmitter long enough for the windows to start lowering to the full open position.

Pressing the Unlock button again will cause the window movement to stop

This feature can be turned off if requested by the customer. This should ONLY be done if the customer requests the feature be turned off.

CTS (VIN A) - Contact Techline to obtain a VCI number to disable this feature.

XTS - Reprogram the Body Control Module (BCM). User selectable option to disable this feature is found in the "Locking" section.
