## PRELIMINARY INFORMATION

**Subject:** Reverse/Dome Lamps And Back Up Camera Inoperative F7DR Fuse Open

**Models:** 2011-2015 Chevrolet Volt

*This PI was superseded to update Condition/Concern fields. Please discard PIC5602B.*

The following diagnosis might be helpful if the vehicle exhibits the symptom(s) described in this PI.

### Condition/Concern

Some customer may state that that have one or all of the following concerns:

1. Reverse lamps Inoperative
2. Rearview Back Up Camera Inoperative ( If Equipped )
3. Dome Lamps Inoperative.
4. Sunshade and map lamps Inoperative
5. Right Side Daytime Running Lamps Inoperative
6. The vehicle may set a DTC: B2615 in the BCM.

### Recommendation/Instructions

Upon general inspection, you may notice that the F7DR (7.5 A) fuse is open in the right instrument panel fuse box.

After initial inspection, a concern can't be found, please inspect circuit 6815 going to the drivers and passenger's sunvisor.

You may have to drop down the front part of the headliner to perform a proper inspection.

If a wiring concern can't be found, move each sunvisor up and down and front to back and see if the fuse opens. If the fuse opens, replace the affected sunvisor.

Please follow this diagnostic or repair process thoroughly and complete each step. If the condition exhibited is resolved without completing every step, the remaining steps do not need to be performed.
