## PRELIMINARY INFORMATION

**Subject:** Drivers Power Or Memory Seat and/or Power Adjustable Pedals Inoperative (Inspect For Poor Terminal Tension)

**Models:** 2015-2016 Cadillac Escalade Models  
2014 Chevrolet Silverado 1500  
2015-2016 Chevrolet Silverado, Tahoe, Suburban  
2014 GMC Sierra 1500  
2015-2016 GMC Sierra and Yukon Models

The following diagnosis might be helpful if the vehicle exhibits the symptom(s) described in this PI.

### Condition/Concern

Some owners may comment of the driver's power seat or the memory seat functions are inoperative. Also, if the vehicle is equipped with adjustable pedals they will be inoperative. While performing diagnosis, check terminal tension at the left IP fuse block (X51L) connector X1 terminals 27 and 28, using the correct Diagnostic Test Probe listed in SI.

**Note:** Terminal 28 at the X1 connector of the left IP fuse block (X51L) is only used on trucks with Adjustable Pedals (RPO JF4) and without Memory (RPO A45).

### Recommendation/Instructions

If terminal tension is found to be poor, it will need to be replaced. The terminal is now available as a terminated lead, part number 19301761, which is now available through CCA parts.
