


## Condition/Concern

Some customers may comment on a grind or growl noise from the transmission while moving. Disassembly of the transmission may find a Front Differential Drive Pinion Gear bearing(s) or Differential Carrier bearing(s) that are damaged.

## Recommendation/Instructions

If a damaged Front Differential Drive Pinion Gear bearing(s) (480), SI# 1726803, and/or Differential Carrier bearing(s) (485, 487), SI# 1726804, are found please contact TAC prior to attempting to remove the distressed bearing(s) from Front Differential Drive Pinion (w/Transfer Gear) Gear Assembly, and/or the Front Differential Carrier Assembly. Do not proceed with any further repairs.





Please follow this diagnostic or repair process thoroughly and complete each step. If the condition exhibited is resolved without completing every step, the remaining steps do not need to be performed.
