Information: **If the instrument illumination brightness value is set to less than 13%, there is a possibility that the activated adaptive cruise control (ACC) or cruise control system will be deactivated automatically for no apparent reason.**

Until further notice, **the instrument illumination brightness value must be set to a value greater than 15% as remedial action in the event of a complaint** (see "Instrument lighting" under "Lights, Direction Indicators and Windshield Wipers" in the Owner's Manual).
