**Subject:** Updated Front Fascia License Plate Bracket Installation Instructions

**Attention:** This Bulletin also applies to any of the models that may be Export vehicles.

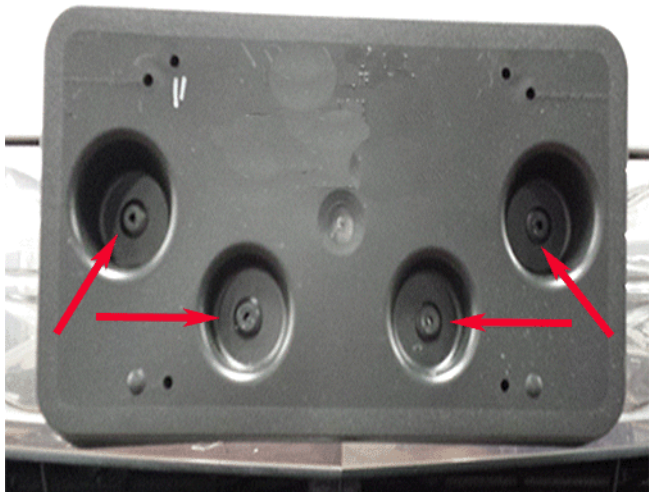

The purpose of this Bulletin is to notify dealership personnel that when installing the license plate bracket, the instructions may be misleading regarding the

location for the fascia's center point, which will leave large gaps between the bracket and fascia. Follow the procedure listed below for the proper installation.

## Service Procedure:



1. **BEFORE** mounting the bracket, on a solid surface, drill four 5.5 mm (7/32 in) holes at the marked locations on the bracket.
2. Align the bracket to the center point on the fascia with the least amount of gap.
3. Using masking tape, mark the position of the left, right and bottom edges.
4. While holding the bracket in place, redrill the holes to mark the location on the fascia.
5. Secure the bracket to the fascia with the rivets provided.

**Note:** Install the top two rivets first followed by the bottom two rivets.
