PI1207D: Spark Knock (Detonation) Type Noise, Malfunction Indicator Lamp Illuminated (MIL), DTC P0324 - (Oct 28, 2014).

PI1247A: Normal Characteristic - Cold Shifts - (Feb 6, 2015).

PIP5312: Normal Operating Characteristics And Diagnostic Tips For The CVT7 Transmission - (Aug 12, 2015).

PIP5275A: Diagnostic Tips For A CVT7 Transmission With a Noise Concern - (Aug 25, 2015).
