PRELIMINARY INFORMATION

Subject: Fog Lamp Operation or Adding / Enabling Fog Lamps On a Vehicle Not Originally Equipped with Fog Lamps

Models: 2010 - 2015 Chevrolet Camaro

This PI was superseded to update Recommendation/Instructions, Model Years and Customer Information. Please discard PIC5287D.

Condition/Concern

This document covers three scenarios relative to Fog Lamps.

Condition 1:

Some customers may comment that their vehicle's fog lamps are inoperative. Further vehicle inspection will identify that the vehicle is equipped with the HID headlamps RPO T4F. Vehicles equipped with HID headlamps (T4F) have DRLs in place of the fog lamps.

Condition 2:

Some customers may comment that their vehicle's fog lamps are inoperative. Further vehicle inspection will identify that the vehicle is equipped with the haloger headlamps RPO T4A. If the vehicle in question has this headlamp option, the servicing technician will have to look for an additional fog lamp RPO to determine if the vehicle was built with factory fog lamps or not. For the 2010 - 2013 model years, the fog lamp option to look for is T3U. For the 2014 - 2015 model years, the fog lamp option to look for is T3Y. If the fog lamp RPO is not listed in VIS, check for a Daytime Running Lamp RPO T3W.

Condition 3:

Some customers may request to have Fog Lamps added or enabled on a vehicle that was not originally built with fog lamps.

Recommendation/Instructions

Correction 1:

This is a normal operating characteristic. No repairs are recommended.

Correction 2:

This is also a normal operating characteristic based on the vehicle build. Fog lamps were not offered on the LS trim level coupes.

Correction 3:

There is not a GM approved fog lamp kit that can be installed on a Camaro that was not originally equipped with that feature.

Customer Information

For Condition 1 and 2, please communicate to the customer this condition is a normal operating characteristic of their vehicle. It will not impact the designed performance or reliability of the vehicle. Please share this information with the customer, including a copy of this message.
