PRELIMINARY INFORMATION

Subject: Left Rear Door Ajar Message Displayed And Dome Lamps Will Not Turn Off When Doors Are Closed

Models: 2015 Chevrolet Express

2015 GMC Savana

The following diagnosis might be helpful if the vehicle exhibits the symptom(s) described in this PI.

Condition/Concern

Some customers may comment that the LEFT REAR DOOR AJAR message is displayed in the IPC and the dome lamps will not turn off when the doors are closed.

Recommendation/Instructions

Inspect circuit 1179 for the swing-out driver-side, 60/40 split door (RPO E26) ajar switch being shorted to ground. The swing-out driver-side, 60/40 split door RPO E26 is no longer offered but the door ajar switch wiring was left in the body wiring harness.

Inspect BCM X6 connector terminal 15 for being shorted to ground. If circuit is shorted to ground, remove terminal from BCM connector and tape circuit back into the harness, as the circuit is not needed.

Inspect wiring around driver front seatbelt retractor at left B-pillar for being pinched to ensure no other wiring is damaged.
