**Subject:** Loss of Power Steering Assist Hard to Steer And/Or Service Power Steering Message On DIC

**Models:** 2015 Chevrolet Colorado  
2015 GMC Canyon

The following diagnosis might be helpful if the vehicle exhibits the symptom(s) described in this PI.

### Condition/Concern

Some Customers may comment of a loss of power steering assist, hard to steer or Service Power Steering message on the DIC. This concern may be intermittent.

### Recommendation/Instructions

Check the PSCM for codes.

If code C056D is found reprogram the PSCM with the latest calibrations.

If code C0545 is found replace the power steering gear assembly.

For any other concerns, perform published diagnostics.
