

1Identify the type of compact key handset currently fitted [gloss finish or matte finish] to the vehicle to ensure a like-for-like replacement handset is fitted:

2Remove the chrome cap; place to one side.




3Remove the key blade.




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4Using the key blade, remove and discard the lower case.



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5Remove the battery from the upper case.


6 CAUTION: make sure the Printed Circuit Board [PCB] is not damaged when removing the black anti-tamper cover. If the copper coil antenna is damaged, the unit will be unserviceable.

Using a suitable tool, cut the fixings of the black anti-tamper cover and lift away from the Printed Circuit Board [PCB].



7 CAUTION: when removing the PCB, only handle the outer edges of the board.

Remove the PCB; place to one side.



8Remove the key ring retainer; place to one side.



9Remove the silicone seal from the lower case; place to one side.

- Discard the upper case.
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10Make sure the foam pads are installed in the lower case as shown.



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11Install the silicone seal to the upper case.



12Install the key ring retainer to the upper case:

• Tighten to 1Nm.



13Make sure the key ring retaining pin is present in the upper case.



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
14 CAUTION: when installing the PCB, only handle the outer edges of the board.

NOTE: the PCB and cover are held in position with the foam pads on the new upper case.

Install the PCB to the upper case.




15Install the PCB anti-tamper cover.





Install the battery to the upper case.



17Install the lower case onto the handset.




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18Install the key blade.



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19Install the chrome cap.



20Check the operation of the compact key handset [all functions].
