Noncompliance Recall: RDX Emission Label

AFFECTED VEHICLES

Year	Model	Trim	VIN Range
2013	RDX	ALL	Check the iN VIN status for eligibility

BACKGROUND

On a small number of RDXs, the vehicle's emission certification label under the hood may have been replaced with a service label listing incorrect information. This would cause the vehicle to be noncompliant with applicable emission regulations.

CUSTOMER NOTIFICATION

Owners of affected vehicles will be sent a notification of this campaign.

Do an iN VIN status inquiry to make sure the vehicle is shown as eligible.

Some vehicles affected by this campaign may be in your used vehicle inventory. These vehicles must be repaired before they are sold.

Should your dealership sell an unrepaired vehicle that subsequently causes injury or damage because of the recalled item, the dealership will be solely responsible to the damaged party and will be required to defend and indemnify American Honda for any resulting claims. To see if a vehicle in inventory is affected by this recall, do a VIN status inquiry before selling it.

CORRECTIVE ACTION

Inspect the emission label and, if necessary, replace if incorrect.

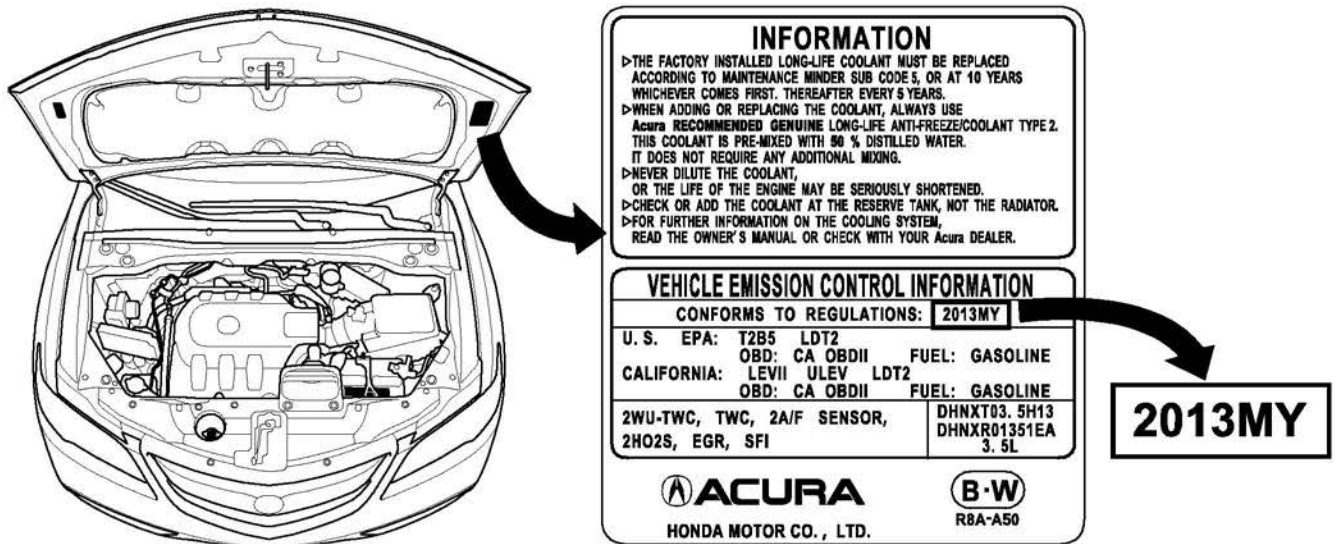

INSPECTION AND REPAIR PROCEDURE

1. Inspect the emission label to confirm **2013** is the model year listed as shown.

- If the correct model year is listed, the vehicle is OK.
- If the wrong model year is listed, replace it with the correct one.
 - Remove the existing emissions label and use 3M adhesive remover to clean any remaining adhesive residue.
 - Using isopropyl (rubbing) alcohol and a clean shop towel, clean the hood area where the emissions label is placed. Allow the area to dry.
 - Peel off the backing from the new emissions label and apply it to the hood. Press the label firmly to make sure it sticks.



2. **For California residents only:** Fill out a Vehicle Emissions Recall – Proof of Correction certificate, and use JU1 as the recall number. Give the certificate to your customer, and advise him or her to keep it as proof that the recall was completed. Your customer will need to submit this certificate to the DMV only if the DMV requests it. If you need more certificates, use reorder number Y0657.
