

The following diagnosis might be helpful if the vehicle exhibits the symptom(s) described in this PI.

### **Condition/Concern**

Some owners may comment that the tailgate contacts the bed floor when the tailgate is closed. This can occur on vehicles with or without the factory spray in bedliner (RPO CGN).



#### **Recommendation/Instructions**

Engineering has released an updated tailgate to correct this concern. Replace the tailgate using the applicable updated part number reflected below.

If the pickup is equipped with a spray-in bed liner, please follow latest version of Service Bulletin 12-08-51-002D: Spray-in Bed Liner General Information and Repair Procedures and submit the cost in Net.
