	Note: As illustrated in the graphic above, most models will have two high retention retainers located at the upper rear of the door trim. Some models may only contain one at that location. Any time a front door trim panel is removed for any repair, the two high retention retainers at the upper rear edge of the door trim (1) will be destroyed during removal.	
Cause	The cause of the condition may be that the retention strength exceeds the strength of the clip.	

Correction



The one or two high retention retainers that are destroyed during removal must be replaced with new high retention retainers to properly reattach the door trim.

Always inspect all retainers/clips for damage and replace as necessary. Refer to *Front Side Door Trim Replacement* in SI for any additional clip replacement or sequencing recommendations.
