Condition	Some 2016 Chevrolet Volt trunk bags may be missing the tire compressor, tire sealant and/or cardboard spacer.
Cause	This may be caused by the components not being placed in the trunk bag during assembly.

Correction

If you encounter a vehicle that is missing one or more of the three components, order the following kit to replace the missing components.

Note: The following kit will include the tire compressor, tire sealant, and the cardboard spacer.
